### Position Requirements:

A working knowledge of archaeological field methods is desired in this position. We are happy to train you on identifying and processing artifacts recovered in the field and to recognize and interpret archaeological features and stratigraphy.

Candidates must be able to perform physically demanding tasks (e.g. walking c. 20km a day or hand excavation) in adverse environmental conditions (e.g., rugged terrain, remote locations, hot and cold temperatures). We start work early in the morning; you will need to get to site or to a central meeting location no later than 7 a.m.

You will need excellent communication skills, both written and verbal.

We work on tight-knit teams out in the field, so successful applicants must be able to work well in groups.

Some jobs may require temporary out of town billeting, so flexibility is required.
