Position Requirements:

Candidates must be able to perform physically demanding tasks (e.g. walking c. 20km a day or hand excavation) in adverse environmental conditions (e.g., rugged terrain, remote locations, hot and cold temperatures). We start work early in the morning; you will need to meet at a central location no later than 7 a.m. to drive to the site or be on site by 8 a.m.

A working knowledge of archaeological field methods is preferred but not required for this position. We are happy to train you on identifying and processing artifacts recovered in the field and to recognize and interpret archaeological features and stratigraphy.

We work in tight-knit teams out in the field, so successful applicants must be able to work well in groups.

You will need excellent communication skills, both written and verbal.

Some jobs may require temporary out of town billeting, so flexibility is required.
