About the Role

ASI is seeking Field Technicians to assess a large area of the Northern Ontario landscape for archaeological resources. Located outside the City of Sudbury, this position involves remote stay with accommodation, transportation, and a per diem provided. This is a physically demanding field-based role requiring work in outdoor environments under varying weather conditions. Responsibilities include:

- Conducting pedestrian surveys and controlled surface pickups, including site mapping
- Excavating test pits and units, identifying stratigraphy, and screening soil for artifacts
- Recording field notes, bagging and tagging artifacts, and following site documentation protocols
- Adhering to health and safety regulations and site-specific risk mitigation measures
- Demonstrate respect throughout Indigenous engagement and when working on culturally sensitive sites
- Working collaboratively in a team-based environment under the supervision of a Field Director
- Traveling to various project sites within Ontario (accommodation, per diems, and transportation provided when required)

Who Should Apply

ASI is looking for individuals who:

- Have an interest in Indigenous and Historical archaeology
- Are comfortable with outdoor, physically demanding work
- Work well in a team environment and follow instructions effectively
- Demonstrate reliability, adaptability, and a positive attitude in field conditions

Qualifications

- Ability to work in physically demanding conditions, including walking long distances up to 20 km per day, lifting and carrying up to 50 lbs, and performing tasks such as digging, bending, and kneeling
- Strong attention to detail and ability to follow instructions
- Ability to travel to designated meeting points for project deployment
- Adaptability and reliability in changing field conditions

- Post-secondary studies in archaeology, museum studies, environmental sciences, or a related field
- Previous experience in archaeological fieldwork (an asset but not required)
